Application Checklist

1. Application to the Toulouse School of Graduate Studies

Must meet the Department of Anthropology deadlines for Fall 2016 of February 1 or April 13, and include all of the following items:

- **Application form.** This is an online application and is common for all Texas universities. It is located at: <https://www.applytexas.org/adappc/commonapp.WBX#>

Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA on the last 60 undergraduate semester hours on the bachelor’s degree, or at least a 3.4 on a completed master’s degree, to receive unconditional admission to graduate school. Applicants who have a GPA between 3.0 and 2.8 on the last 60 hours of the bachelor’s degree, or an overall undergraduate GPA between 2.6 and 2.8, or between a 3.4 and 3.0 GPA on a completed master’s degree, may be considered by individual review for provisional admission. Applicants with a GPA below 2.8 on the last 60 semester hours, or below 2.6 overall, or below 3.0 on a completed master’s degree are eligible to pursue undergraduate course work only.

- **Transcripts from all previous college work.** Transcripts must be sent directly to the following addresses:

Please DO NOT send transcripts to the Department of Anthropology. This slows down the application process.

- **GRE scores.** Official GRE scores must be submitted to the Toulouse School of Graduate Studies. The UNT school code for the GRE is 6481. Allow at least 4 weeks for GRE scores to arrive at the

Toulouse School of Graduate Studies. Applicants who wait to take the GRE until the application deadline may not be considered. Scores must arrive by the time application review begins.

Note: International applicants must go through the International Studies Office, not the Toulouse School of Graduate Studies. Please review the International Studies Office website for more information about degree equivalencies, English requirements, and the application process.

2. Application to the Department of Anthropology

The Department of Anthropology begins review of applications approximately one month after each application deadline. This is because applicants must be accepted by the Toulouse School of Graduate Studies BEFORE their application can be reviewed by the Department of Anthropology. The Toulouse School of Graduate Studies takes approximately 1 month to make decisions.

Application materials must meet the Department of Anthropology deadlines of Jan 30 or April 10, and include all of the following items:

Applicants must submit 3 Reference Evaluation Forms (or letters of recommendation) from persons familiar with their academic record. Letters must be sealed in an envelope with the author's signature placed across the seal. We prefer that they are included in your application packet, but they may also be mailed directly to the Department of Anthropology. If an applicant received an undergraduate degree from UNT, only 2 references may come from the UNT anthropology faculty.

- **Statement of purpose.** This essay should be 500-750 words and discuss the following: Why studying applied anthropology is an important part of your educational and career goals? How do you see applied anthropology helping you achieve these goals? Highlight your past experiences in anthropology (or a related field) and how they will guide your future goals. Avoid vague statements about anthropology that don't tell us much about you and your goals. We want to know that applicants are focused but understand that interests may change once students interact with new faculty.

- **Writing sample.** This should be a significant piece of scholarly work from your undergraduate career or any research you have done since you graduated.
