# Anthropological Field Methods ANTH 4011

When one begins to see things through the eyes of an anthropologist it's as if a switch gets turned on...and stays stuck there. It's when culture goes beyond our National Geographic imaginations and ventures into the minutiae of people's everyday routines. This class is a workshop...this syllabus, a living document...where we will walk the footsteps of the anthropologist's mind and train not only to see but to wrestle with culture. We begin with the most difficult culture to face, our own...

## Concept Papers (5 papers)

Take home essay questions following each fieldwork exercise (4x). These assignments are practice in analyzing your experiential work in terms of the concepts we are discussing in class. 300-500 words.

#### Midterm Exam

A take home essay targeting a concept based question. 500-700 words.

#### Final Exam

A take home essay that develops an original research question based on preliminary research encounters. 1000-1500 words.
