
Thesis Research Project


Topic: An investigation into individuals relate to nature and gain a better understanding of visitor use and perspectives regarding Texas State Parks and park educational programming.


Client: Texas Park and Wildlife Department – State Parks - Director of Interpretation and Exhibits.
