My Timeline

- 2012: Graduated with my B.A. in Anthropology from UTSA
- 2012-2014: Worked as an accounting manager at an "environmental" and engineering company in the oil and gas sector.
- **2014:** Realized what fracking was and how it negatively impacted the environment. Decided to go to grad school as I considered the following:
 - What matters to me?
 - What would I like to be doing in 5 years?
 - Who's doing that work and how did they get there?
- **2014 2016:** Worked on my applied anthropology master's degree by focusing my thesis on the impacts and experiences faced by people living near oil and gas extraction. My client was my current employer Earthworks who focuses on these issues across the country.
- 2016-2019: Went from working on local issues in Karnes County,
 Texas to leading broad national groups on plastics campaigns as
 related to fracking issues (i.e. 99% of plastics come from fossil
 fuels) and leading trips to Latin American to help with antifracking campaigns

I support residents in advocating for more state air monitoring and better policies to protect them from the impacts of oil and gas extraction.

Steering Committee member for the global Break Free From Plastics Movement

I use a bottom-up approach to inform movement building strategies in the US to reduce the dependency on fossil fuels and plastics.

Latin America Liaison

I work with allies in Latin American to help ban fracking in areas where it currently does not exist. We use tools and factsheets to help spread awareness on the impacts of fracking.
