Typical Responsibilities

- Leads qualitative thematic analysis, including the development of a codebook, process for monitoring coder agreement or reliability, and summary of themes
- Provides day-to-day coordination and management of project-related tasks
- Leads participant recruitment and data collection efforts
- Independently conducts qualitative interviewing
- Cleans and analyzes quantitative data
- Works with clients to determine the project scope and the methodology to best suit their needs

Example Research Projects

Decision-Making and Behavior

- Oregon Youth & Young Adult Fentanyl Survey
 Distributed and analyzed survey results of an
 online survey asking youth and young adults
 (ages 15-25) about their knowledge and
 experiences with fentanyl and pills.
- Prescriber Reports

Conducted asynchronous, online focus group of stimulant prescribers in the state to understand their perspectives on utility of Prescriber Reports and impact on prescribing practices.

Outcomes Evaluation

Measure 110

Interviewed peers about their work following increased funding for Behavioral Health Resource Networks due to M110 legislation.

Needs Assessments

Overdose Response Needs Assessment
 Interviewed, coded, and analyzed current
 overdose response needs of local public
 health agencies.
